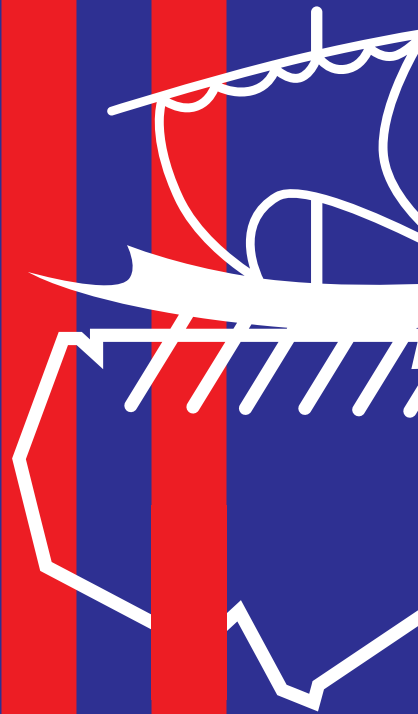
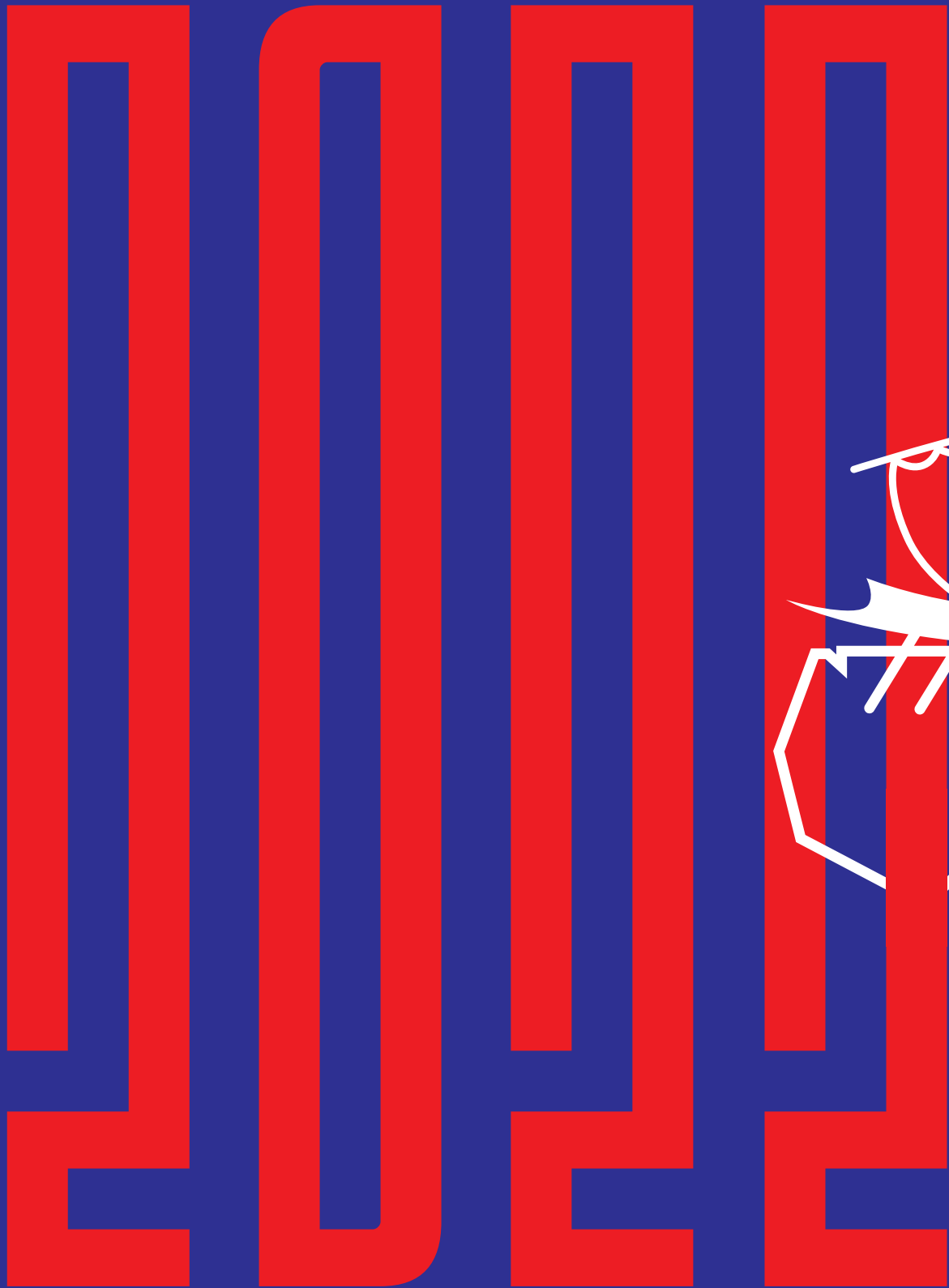


Annual Review

AmCham Greece is an active member of the US Chamber of Commerce in Washington DC and AmChams in Europe, the umbrella organization for 46 American Chambers of Commerce from 44 countries throughout Europe and Eurasia.

AMCHAM GREECE PUBLISHES

AmCham Greece publications are one of the Chamber's foremost interface tools and include a number of regular as well as ad hoc publications. Regular publications the Annual Review, providing an overview of the Chamber's activities; the Directory, an annual index of the Chamber's members that includes an overview of business and economic developments as well as essential information on doing business in Greece and the US; and Business Partners, a bimonthly magazine with specially curated content for and about Chamber members. Other publications include sectorial and informational whitepapers and targeted toolkits and guides.

AMCHAM GREECE SPECIALIZES

AmCham Greece draws upon the expertise and experience of its members to create specialized sectoral committees that bring together business leaders, specialists and experts from across a variety of industries and disciplines to share knowledge, develop new initiatives and advance the interests of the member companies. Committee activities include targeted advocacy work, focused events and actions, specialized reports, as well as policy analysis and development of policy proposals, including proposing changes to draft legislation prepared by the government. Committees also aim to supply AmCham Greece member companies with useful information and advice in their respective areas of expertise.

TRADEUSA

Established in 2013, TradeUSA is the international trade department of the American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce. Through a multitude of actions and initiatives, it provides invaluable information, insight, support, and guidance to Greek companies seeking to successfully enter and/or further expand their export opportunities in the US market. TradeUSA regularly organizes targeted workshops and seminars for aspiring exporters in cities across Greece, in collaboration with local authorities, and also provides one-on-one consulting services, including on regulatory compliance with the FDA. Through a host of trade missions, exhibitions and B2B meetings, it creates networking opportunities to bring Greek exporters together with US importers, distributors and buyers. In 2016, TradeUSA also launched the annual ExportUSA Forum, which is the only forum in Greece focusing solely on exporting to the US market..

Congratulatory Letter by US Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo

During the course of at the virtual New Year's Reception on February 3, President Bakatselos also read aloud a congratulatory letter from United States Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo sent on the occasion of the chamber's 90th anniversary, which recognized the Chamber's role as “an extremely valuable partner in [the] joint efforts to strengthen US-Greek economic relations” and “a key force behind Greece's ability to successfully revitalize its economy.” AmCham Greece is honored to be recognized for its contribution in strengthening US-Greek economic relations and for being a key force in helping to successfully revitalize the Greek economy.

Closed Meeting with DAS Olson

A delegation of AmCham Greece held a closed working breakfast meeting with Erika Olson, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State overseeing policy for Southern Europe and the Caucasus, to discuss a broad range of issues relating to US-Greece relations and the potential for further development of trade and investment

between the two countries, as well as issues relating to regional cooperation, stability and security and the broader, global economic and business environment. The meeting took place in Athens on February 16. In attendance were DAS Olson, high ranking representatives of the United States Embassy in Athens and an AmCham Greece delegation.

Solidarity With Ukraine

AmChams in Europe, the umbrella organization for 46 AmChams in 44 countries across Europe and Eurasia, stood in solidarity with the people of Ukraine. The ongoing invasion of Ukraine violates international law and endangers peace and security across the region. It poses a clear threat to fundamental values of human dignity, democracy, rule of law, and solidarity. Our thoughts went out to all the individuals who are directly impacted across the region, including our fellow AmCham colleagues, their members, partners, and relatives. Our network brings together individuals and organizations with deep ties across Europe and Eurasia, and around the world. It is built upon a strong belief in the importance of cooperation, dialogue and cultural understanding. The military actions underway jeopardize those ideals. AmChams in Europe supports all ongoing efforts to avoid further escalation, protect civilians and safeguard security and prosperity across the region.

AmCham Greece Signs MoU with Elevate Greece

With an eye to boosting the country's startup ecosystem AmCham Greece and Elevate Greece, a Greek government initiative to identify and support promising startups, signed a memorandum of understanding on March 10. The collaboration aims at training, mentoring and providing networking opportunities for startups, and will build on the Chamber's extensive business network and decades of knowhow and expertise in driving the growth of entrepreneurship and innovation in the country. In the context of the MoU, AmCham Greece aims to help create a solid foundation for the development of competitive and innovative products and services, facilitate their access to international markets, contribute to creating employment opportunities for young scientists, and create added value for the country.

Business Beyond Borders: Skopje

AmCham Greece and the American Chamber of Commerce in North Macedonia jointly organized "Business Beyond Borders," a trade mission to Skopje that took place on March 21-22, with the support of the US Embassy in Greece and the US Embassy in North Macedonia. With a focus on North Macedonia's business and investment environment, the trade mission gave participants an opportunity to access in-depth and up-to-date information on the country's growing market and explore the range of local investment opportunities.

Meeting With US DAS Lochman

US Deputy Assistant Secretary for Energy Diplomacy in the Bureau of Energy Resources at the US Department of State Laura Lochman participated in a breakfast meeting hosted by AmCham Greece on April 6. The discussion focused on the general landscape of the energy sector in Greece today, the strategy for energy diversification and adequacy, prospects in renewables and hydrogen, e-mobility, and energy conservation. Participants had the opportunity to highlight Greece's potential as a key energy hub and producer, and the role it can play regionally and for Europe in general, and discussed current and upcoming investment opportunities in Greece's energy sector.

AmCham Greece hosts U.S. Ambassador to Turkey Jeffry L. Flake

Over the past six years, AmCham Greece has forged inseparable ties

that will continue in the Ambassador's new role as US Assistant Secretary of State for Energy Resources.

On May 10, Ambassador George James Tsunis presented his credentials to President of the Hellenic Republic Katerina Sakellaropoulou, officially taking up his position as the new Ambassador of the United States to Greece. AmCham Greece extends its heartfelt welcome to Ambassador Tsunis on his appointment and looks forward to working together to further strengthen the close partnership between Greece and the United States.

AmCham Greece's Spring 2022 Mission to the US

This May, AmCham Greece traveled to the United States for a series of top-level meetings, showcasing Greek business, advocating for its members, and exploring opportunities for Greece, Greek companies and the Chamber itself to forge meaningful partnerships and make headway in vital sectors and fields including energy, gender equity and transatlantic cooperation.

AmCham Greece-DYPA Survey Skills For The New Normal

In the context of AmCham Greece's MoU with the Greek Public Employment Service (DYPA) to improve the matching of supply and demand in the Greek labor market, we are calling on Chamber members to take part in a specially developed survey designed to identify the skills employers are looking for in order to thrive in the new normal. The survey's findings will be used to develop targeted educational programs and initiatives for DYPA's vocational training institutes (IEK), vocational apprenticeship schools (EPAS) and reskilling programs with the goal of improving skills matching in the country, which currently ranks 30th out of 31 on Cedefop's European Skills Index 2022.

AmCham Greece Hosts US Congressional Delegation

On July 6, AmCham Greece a working luncheon for the US Congressional Delegation led by Congressman Gregory Meeks, Chair of the United States House Committee on Foreign Affairs. The luncheon was further attended by United States Ambassador to Greece George James Tsunis, as well as US Embassy officials and AmCham Greece members, who had the opportunity to exchange insights and discuss key issues concerning the economic, trade and business relations between Greece and the United States as well as how these are affected by ongoing global developments.

Annual General Assembly and Election 2022

AmCham Greece convened its Annual General Assembly on June 29 in Athens. Chamber members assembled for an overview of the Chamber's activities, initiatives and output over the past year, which highlighted the work of the Chamber's various specialized committees, and a review of the financial data for that period. The agenda of the 2022 Annual General Assembly also included the Chamber's triennial elections, with members casting their vote for the 25 members of the new Board of Directors, who subsequently convened on July 1 to vote for the Executive Committee and to appoint, on merit, a further six honorary members to the Board. The vote formally confirmed the reelection of Nikolaos Bakatselos as President of AmCham Greece for a second three-year term.

AmCham Greece and HDB Sign an MoU

AmCham Greece and the Hellenic Development Bank (HDB) signed a Memorandum of Understanding on November 29 and joined forces to boost Greek entrepreneurship through a series of targeted actions and initiatives that will build on the Chamber's significant expertise and contact network, committing to develop, organize and implement synergies between the two organizations aimed at promoting and enhancing entrepreneurship in the country. The partnership will focus on enhancing the extroversion of Greek businesses and promoting technology transfer, knowledge exchange, and the dissemination of good practices.

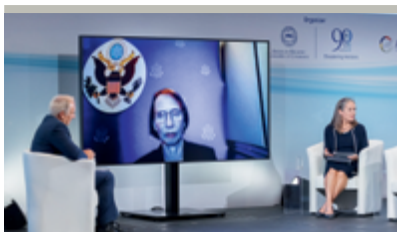

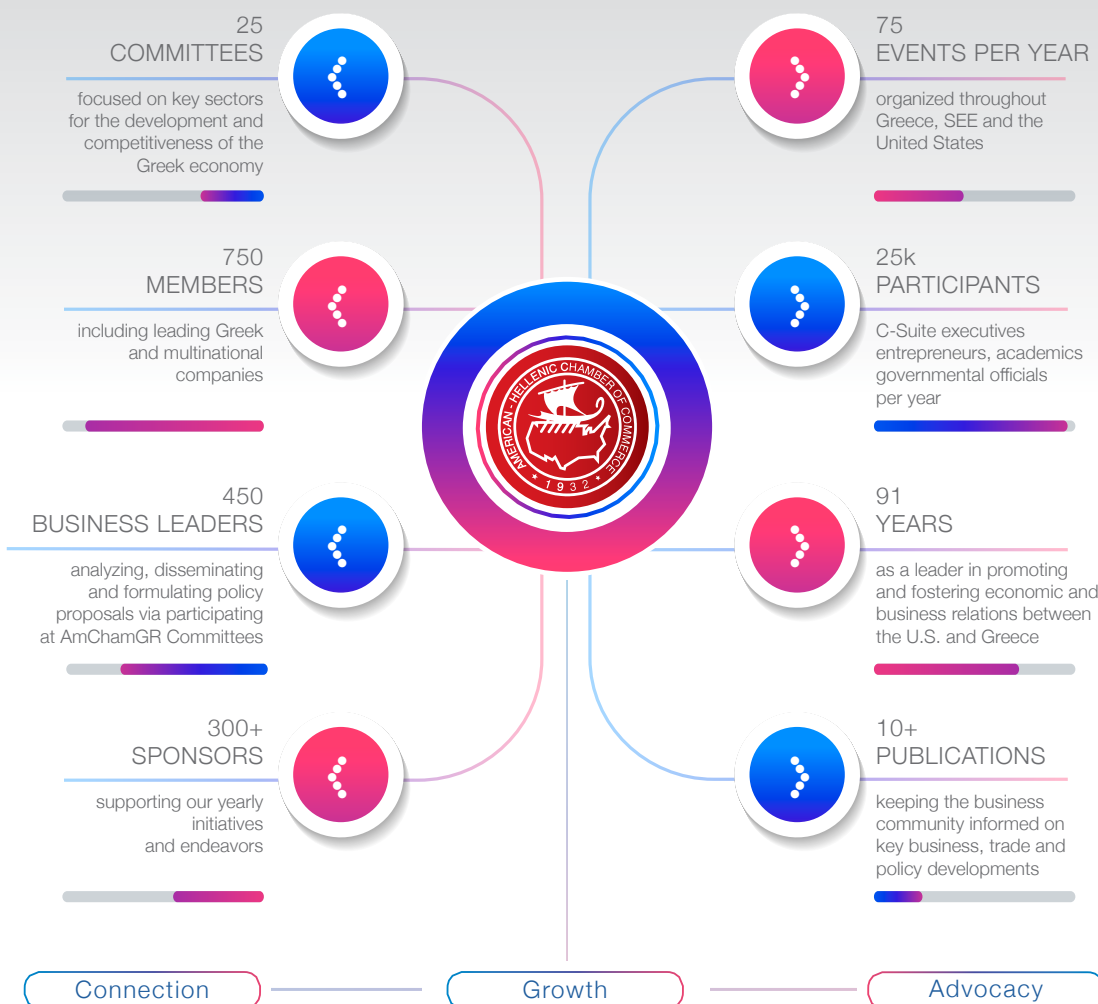
