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Elly Andriopoulou, Managing Director, Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center

Elly Andriopoulou is the Managing Director of the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center (SNFCC), appointed in June 2020 and reappointed in December 2023. She also serves on the Alpha Bank Board of Directors as a Non-Executive Director. Before joining the SNFCC, Elly held leadership positions in banking, strategy consulting, and philanthropy. After her MBA studies, Elly worked as a consultant for Oliver Wyman in Boston and then moved to Citibank in Greece where she held various positions before becoming the Marketing Director. In 2012, she joined the Stavros Niarchos Foundation where she prepared the business plan and future operation of the SNFCC and later managed the grants through which the SNF supports the SNFCC's operation, since it was donated to the Greek State. She holds an MBA from Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University, and a BA in Psychology from Deree College.



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Andreas Athanassopoulos, Executive Director and CEO, Olympia Group

Andreas Athanassopoulos has extensive experience in banking, retail, and business both in Greece and abroad for over 25 years. Throughout his career, he has been responsible for leading the design and implementation of large-scale strategic growth plans, whether organic or non-organic. From 2020 to 2023, he served as Deputy CEO and Executive Member of the Board of Directors at Eurobank, holding the role of Group Chief Transformation Officer. Prior to that, from early 2018 to late 2020, he worked as Chief Customer Officer and CEO Financial Services at DixonsCarphone London headquarters and, between 2013 and 2017 he was CEO of Kotsovolos, where he successfully transformed the company bringing it back to full profitability. 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Michail Bletsas, Governor, National Cybersecurity Authority of Greece

Michail Bletsas has served as Governor of the National Cybersecurity Authority since April 2024, actively contributing to the development of the national cybersecurity strategy. He is a Research Scientist and Director of Computing at the MIT Media Lab, where he has worked since 1996, overseeing the production, transmission, consumption, and storage of data. He was a core member of the technical and design team of the “One Laptop per Child” (OLPC) initiative, which created the pioneering and award-winning XO laptop. His research focuses on network security, countering the systematic spread of disinformation, wireless networks, and machine learning infrastructure. He has advised governments on technology policy and served as an expert to high-level officials. He holds a degree in Electrical Engineering from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and an MSc in Computer Engineering from Boston University.

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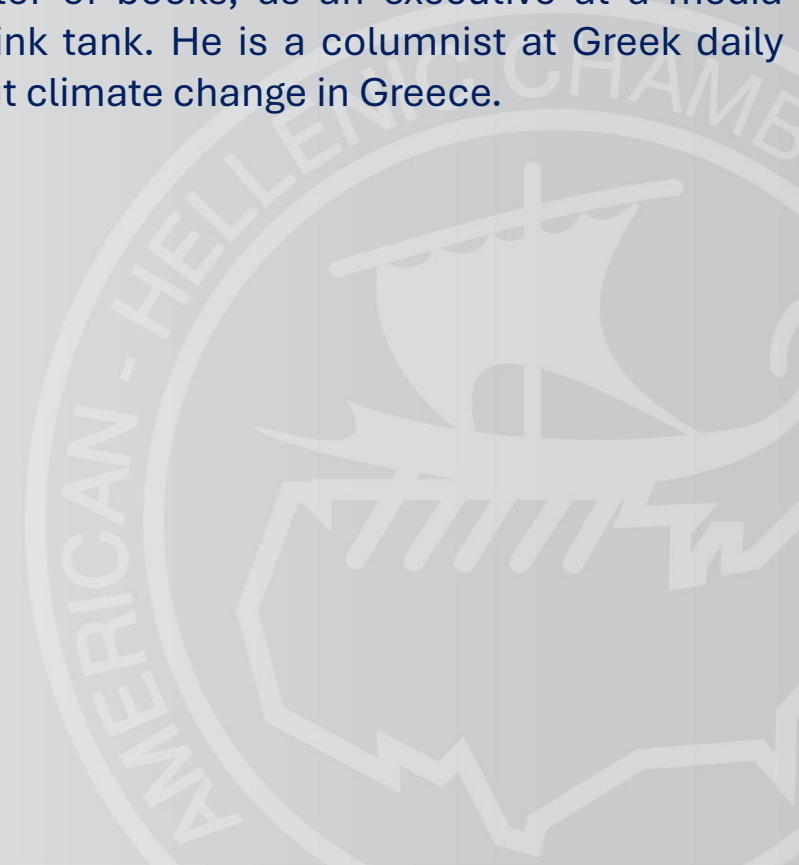


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Thodoris Georgakopoulos, Journalist, Kathimerini

Thodoris Georgakopoulos is a writer, journalist and the founder of 1830 Lab. He has worked as a columnist at magazines, newspapers and digital media, as a translator and editor of books, as an executive at a media company and as the editorial director of diaNEOsis, a non-profit think tank. He is a columnist at Greek daily Kathimerini since 2013, and the author of five books. His latest is about climate change in Greece.



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Katerina Evangelatos, Theater and Opera Director

Katerina Evangelatos is an acclaimed stage director for theater and opera. She was born in Athens and stems from a well known artistic family. She studied philosophy (NKUA), music (Hellenic Conservatory, piano, guitar) and theatre (directing, acting) in Athens (National Theatre of Greece Drama School), London (Middlesex University) and Moscow (Academy of Theatre Arts GITIS), receiving scholarships and awards. In 2019 she was appointed Artistic Director of Greece's leading cultural organization, the Athens Epidaurus Festival. She is the first woman and the youngest person ever to hold this position. Throughout her tenure, the Festival has established its position as one of Europe's leading Festivals and extended its activities during the winter, inventing new platforms and spinning dynamic discussions within international and local audiences. Moreover, during her tenures she significantly expanded the Festival's collaboration within the fields of Science, Enterprise and prestigious Cultural Foundations. She has directed over 30 big large scale productions at major venues and institutions in Greece and abroad, including the National Theatre of Greece, Athens Epidaurus Festival, Onassis Stegi, Shanghai Dramatic Arts Centre, Greek National Opera, Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Centre, Perm Opera and Ballet Theatre in Russia, the State Theater of Augsburg in Germany, Hong Kong Arts Festival etc. moving from ancient drama to opera and from adapted literature and classic works to contemporary repertoire. She often translates the works she directs. She has taught at the Department of Theatre Studies (Athens and Peloponnese Universities) and in drama schools. Moreover, she has given lectures and workshops in universities in USA and serves as advisor to several artistic institutions and committees in Greece and abroad. For her productions, she has gained international recognition and has been awarded several prestigious distinctions. Most recently, she was awarded one of the highest honours of the French Republic, the Knight of the Order of Arts and Letters, in recognition of her contributions as a theatre director and as the Artistic Director of the Athens Epidaurus Festival. Recent work includes a new adaptation and staging of Aristophanes' "Lysistrata" at the Shanghai Dramatic Arts Centre (2026).

Her last book received the National Essay Prize in Greece and was translated in English: *Historical Memory in Greece, 1821-1930. Performing the Past in the Present* (Routledge 2022).

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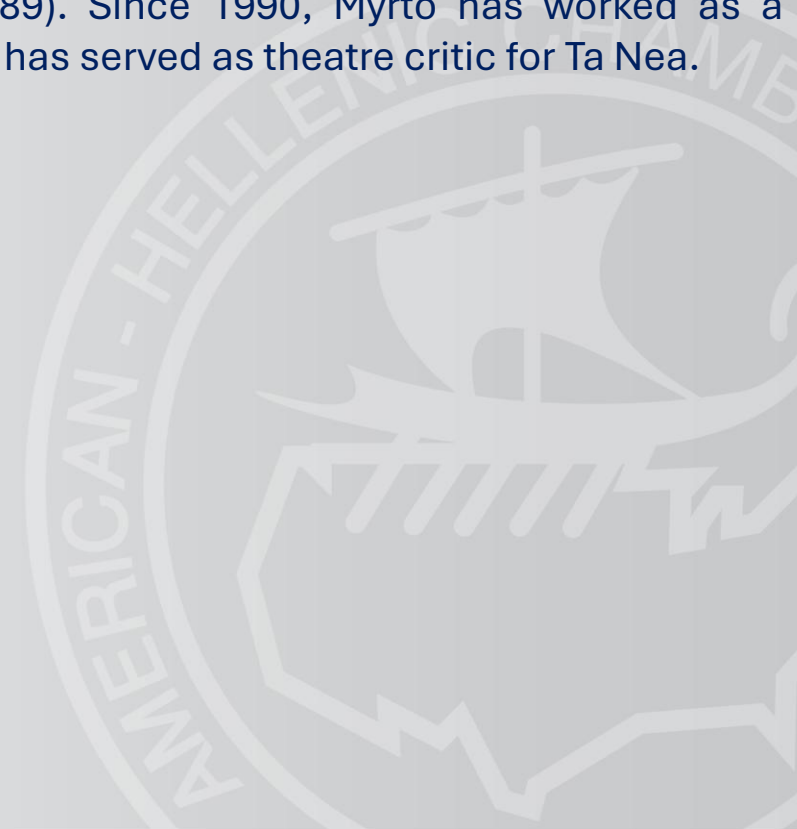
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Myrto Loverdou, Journalist, To Vima

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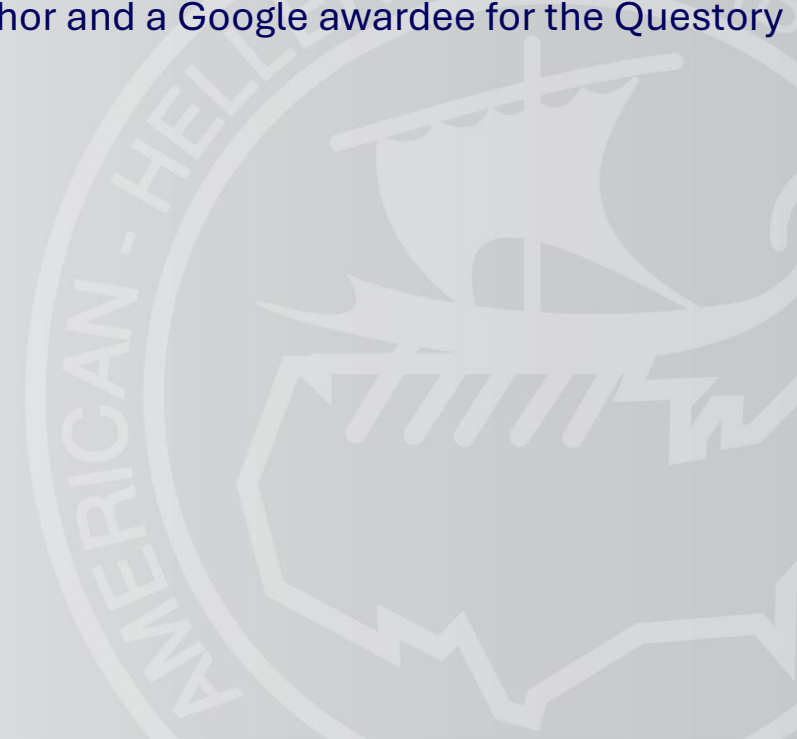
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Agnes Mariakaki, CEO, MindSearch

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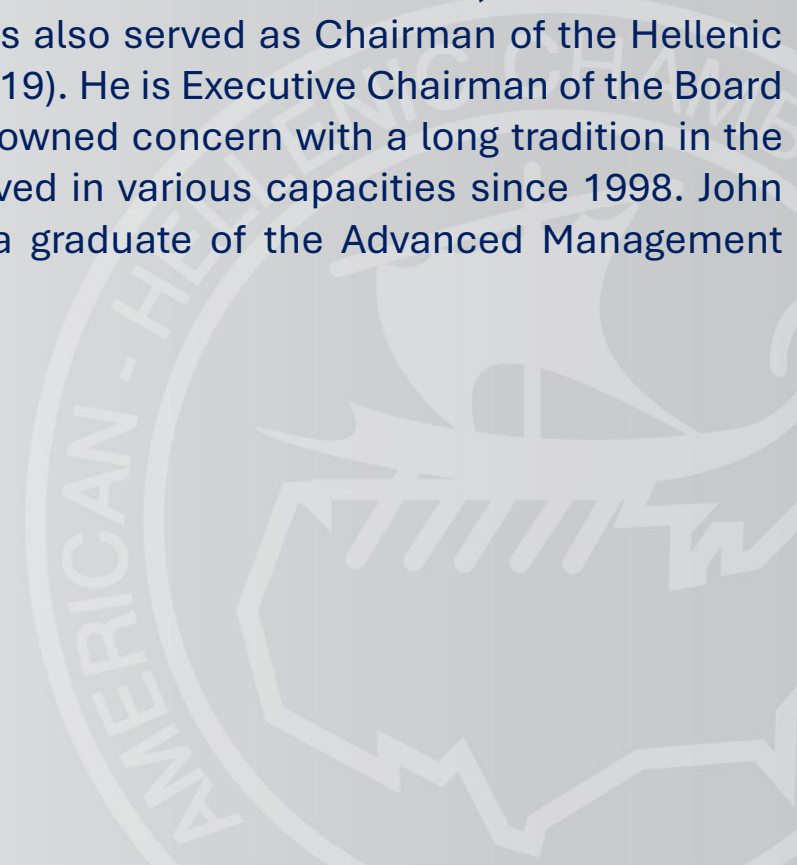


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John D. Saracakis, President, American-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce

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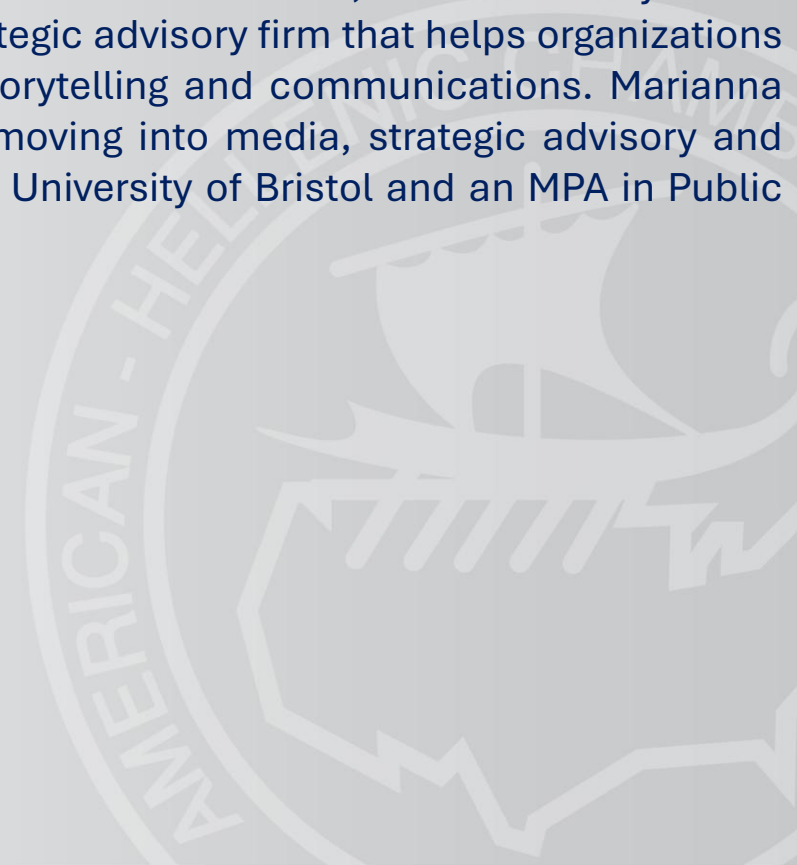


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Marianna Skylakaki, Founder & Publisher, αθηNEA
